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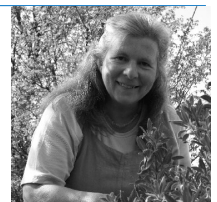
**Discovering the fascinating world of bees.**

In addition to numerous interesting details from the life of a bee colony, the authors describe above all what can be done with children over the course of a year on the subject of bees: from building nesting boxes for wild bees and bumblebees, painting bee dwellings and harvesting honey, to creating Christmas decorations with beeswax.
